chester cricket the famous cricket in times square is homesick when his friend mario takes him to a sky show at the planetarium chester realizes how much he misses seeing real stars at night happily he finds his way out of the subway into times square where he meets a new friend lulu pigeon lulu takes him on a trip beyond his wildest dreams from central park to the top of the empire state building from the statue of liberty and back to times square chester sees manhattan in style and

even finds a little bit of country in the city

new editions of old favorites meet harry kitten and tucker mouse no one would ever dream that a cat and mouse could become friends but that doesn t stop harry and tucker all they have is each other to depend on together they begin an exciting adventure throughout new york searching for a home they can call their own but the two friends run into some troublesome times in their journey around town is all hope lost where will they turn to next join chester cricket and his friends in this classic tale from george selden

two works by the author of the cricket in times square which feature many of the same characters are collected into one paperback edition original

be uprooted and dropped into a busy and overwhelming city to learn about friendship and belonging take all the work out of planning a lesson so there s more time focused on comprehension and engaging hands on follow up activities do some research on the importance of crickets in the chinese culture compare chinatown with times square by listing three differences describe chester s dream and what he did in response to it find the words the author used to represent sounds and explain what sounds they represent imagine what it would be like for harry and tucker to visit chester in the country get into the skin of tucker to tell how he would act if he found money in times square aligned to your state standards and written to bloom s taxonomy additional crossword word search comprehension quiz and answer key are also included about the novel the cricket in times square is the newbery honor winning story of a cricket who finds himself taken away from his country home and dropped right in the times square subway station chester cricket enjoys his home in connecticut however one day he is brought to the city and immediately misses home while in times square chester meets tucker mouse and harry cat who quickly become friends with the musical insect chester is also adopted by mario a young boy who s family runs a small newspaper stand in the station throughout the story chester finds himself amidst many obstacles and struggling to prove he belongs in the big city

an updated version of the timeless children s classic featuring a business savvy mouse a kind alley cat and a talented country cricket featuring a new foreword and revisions by ya author stacey lee tucker is a streetwise city mouse he thought he d seen it all but he s never met a cricket before which really isn t surprising because along with his friend harry cat tucker lives in the very heart of new york city the times square subway station chester cricket never intended to leave his connecticut meadow he d be there still if he hadn t followed the entrancing aroma of liverwurst right into someone s picnic basket now like any tourist in the city he wants to look around and he could not have found two better guides and friends than tucker and harry the trio have many adventures from taking in the sights and sounds of broadway to escaping a smoky fire chester makes a third friend too it is a boy mario who rescues chester from a dusty corner of the subway station and brings him to live in the safety of his parents newsstand he hopes at first to keep chester as a pet but mario soon understands that the cricket is more than that because chester has a hidden talent and no one not even chester himself realizes that the little country cricket may just be able to teach even the toughest new yorkers a thing or two the cricket in times square is george selden at his best and the new illustrations and interior images by garth williams make this edition a special treat

this book is about young children and their writing and reading development during their first few years of life it stops at the point where most books on beginning writing and reading start when the child is 5 6 years old and is able to write and read in ways recognized as actually being writing and reading the chapters are authored by many of the leading researchers of written language development in very young children
