crucial. Look for books with simple sentence structure. Avoid overly complex sentences that might overwhelm the reader. Repetitive phrases and patterns help build fluency and confidence. Engaging illustrations and pictures help clarify meaning and keep the reader interested. Themes relevant to children's lives. Books about friendship, family, or animals are often engaging. Varying genres expose the child to different types of texts, including fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and even comics. The Role of Parents and Educators.
