informed what we know today as qualitative research the text reflects these more traditional as well as emerging qualitative research approaches providing a theoretically grounded approach to designing and implementing qualitative research studies while some introductory research texts focus on the specific methods of qualitative research with little attention to the role of theory this book forefronts theory in qualitative research the authors speak to students new to qualitative research with clear discussions of theory and theoretical concepts and how those notions must be considered throughout all aspects of research design implementation and representation of findings each chapter integrates discussion of theory in addition the book highlights the role of ethics in the same way with a chapter at the beginning as well as discussions of ethics threaded throughout each of the design chapters qualitative research design and methods is the introductory textbook for students taking introductory masters and doctoral courses in qualitative research instructors in those classes will appreciate the straightforward language and concepts provided by the authors perfect for courses such as introduction to qualitative research and qualitative research design

this book charts the development of creative writing bringing it from china to the world as the second volume of chinese creative writing studies the first of which introduces chinese creative writing to english speaking readers this book expands on the first in further developing theories and research on creative writing pedagogy in the chinese context and in hong kong particular looking at creative writing within cross media practices and the implications for creative writing in global contexts the volume does so by presenting both local and international voices to expand the horizon of chinese creative writing development structured in four parts the book begins with leading chinese scholars reflections on research and field the second part focuses on the interlinkages between creative writing and pedagogy in hong kong the third section discusses poetic thinking and therapeutic writing to highlight their relationship with the personal and community lastly the book takes a global perspective to examine the pedagogy and practice of creative writing through interviews with leaders in the field it is relevant to researchers teachers and students interested in creative writing particularly chinese creative writing but also those working in comparative contexts both culturally and in terms of cross media perspectives

filled jesus in a struggle against satan to establish the kingdom of god by liberating people to form a community that does god's will this discourse develops throughout the narrative by means of repetition and variation functioning rhetorically to persuade the reader that god manifests power out of suffering rejection and death this book fits among literary studies that focus on mark as a unified narrative and rhetorical composition and uses narrative analysis as a key tool while narrative approaches to mark generally offer non apocalyptic readings this study clarifies the symbols metaphors and themes of mark 3:22-30 in light of the religious and social context in which the gospel was produced in order to understand mark's persuasive aims towards the reader accordingly a comparative analysis of jewish apocalyptic literature informs the use of mark 3:22-30 as a paradigm for the gospel
