this book provides an up to date review and analysis of health care reform in five countries germany sweden the netherlands the united kingdom and the united states it reviews the experience of introducing competition into the health service as well as policies to strengthen management and change methods of paying hospitals and doctors the experience of each country is described by experts from the countries concerned in this lucid introduction chris ham sets out the context of reform and in the conclusion identifies the emerging lessons the book provides an authoritative introduction to health care reform in europe and north america at a time of increasing political and public interest in this field it has been designed for students of social policy and the full range of health service practitioners on courses of professional training

this volume explores the central issues driving the present process of healthcare reform in europe 17 chapters written by scholars and policy makers from all parts of europe draw together the available evidence from epidemiology and public health economics public policy organizational behaviour and management theory as well as real world policy making experience laying out the options that health sector decision makers confront through its cross disciplinary cross national approach the book highlights the underlying trends that now influence health policy formulation across europe an authoritative introduction provides a broad synthesis of present trends and strategies in european health policy

health care reforms around the world from europe and north america to africa latin america and asia seem to all be market oriented reforms driven by international business interests and right wing political parties there seems to be a sudden and broad concern with the efficiency of medical care with the assertion that democratically or professionally run systems are inherently inefficient far less concern is evident for the more traditional values held regarding medical care effectiveness or quality and equity the fact is that we have little good cross national research that systematically addresses the reform issue this book addresses that problem and attempts to look at health care reforms in a number of countries representing as wide a spectrum as

possible and using a common conceptual framework that allows for comparable information to be gathered and presented on each despite differing levels of socio economic development the authors agreed on a set of models that were thought to provide reasonable guidance in answering the questions of the source of pressures for reform the alternative modes of organization that have been found in the world in recent years and the direction of change among those alternatives

you won t have to worry about going broke if you get sick we will start to bring the costs of health care under control and we will do all this while reducing the federal deficit that is the promise of the affordable care act but from the moment president obama signed the bill into law in 2010 a steady and mounting avalanche of misinformation about the aca has left a growing majority of americans confused about what it is why it s necessary and how it works if you re one of them buy this book from how to tame the twin threats of rising costs and the increasing number of uninsured to why an insurance mandate is good for your health health care reform dispels false fears by arming you with facts

the reform of american medical care is the most important topic on the nation s domestic agenda and the centerpiece of the clinton administration s plans for social policy and long term economic development this book written by a preeminent analyst of medical politics and policy who is a frequent adviser to congress helps to clarify the current debate over the president s bill and the proposed alternatives to it it is essential reading theodore marmor whose work has appeared in the nation s major newspapers and magazines as well as in scholarly journals and books here presents some of his most recent writings that illuminate the historical political and economic

arguing that health care should be a human right rather than a commodity the distinguished contributors to this volume call for a new social covenant establishing a right to a standard of health care consistent with society s level of resources by linking rights with limits they offer a framework for seeking national consensus on a cost conscious standard of universal medical care the authors identify the policy implications of recognizing and implementing such a right and develop specific criteria to measure the success of health care reform from a human rights perspective health care reform also offers specific and timely criticism of managed competition and its offspring the clinton plan for health care reform because health care reform will inevitably be an ongoing process of assessment and revision especially since managed competition has not been implemented elsewhere this book will last beyond the moment by providing vital standards to guide the future evolution of the health care system

zhou presents a collection of papers that are based on lectures presented at the 36th annual public lecture seminar series conducted by his department of economics at western michigan university the six chapters explore medicare reform managed care and its effect on the health care system efforts to cover the uninsured the effect of health insurance on labor market and employment decisions and the role of tax policy in health care the contributions largely limit themselves to analysis of existing institutions and eschew broad proscriptions for the american health care system c book news inc
