first published in 1989 just before the gulf war broke out republic of fear was the only book that explained the motives of the saddam hussein regime in invading and annexing kuwait this edition updated in 1998 has a substantial introduction focusing on the changes in hussein s regime since the gulf war in 1968 a coup d état brought into power an extraordinary regime in iraq one that stood apart from other regimes in the middle east between 1968 and 1980 this new regime headed by the arab ba th socialist party used ruthless repression and relentless organization to transform the way iraqis think and react to political questions in just twelve years a party of a few thousand people grew to include nearly ten percent of the iraqi population this book describes the experience of ba thism from 1968 to 1980 and analyzes the kind of political authority it engendered culminating in the personality cult around saddam hussein fear the author argues is at the heart of ba thi politics and has become the cement for a genuine authority however bizarre examining iraqi history in a search for clues to understanding

the looting of the iraqi national museum in april of 2003 provoked a world outcry at the loss of artifacts regarded as part of humanity s shared cultural patrimony but though the losses were unprecedented in scale the museum looting was hardly the first time that iraqi heirlooms had been plundered or put to political uses from the beginning of archaeology as a modern science in the nineteenth century europeans excavated and appropriated iraqi antiquities as relics of the birth of western civilization since iraq was created in 1921 the modern state has used archaeology to forge a connection to the ancient civilizations of mesopotamia and or islamic empires and so build a sense of nationhood among iraqis of differing religious traditions and ethnicities this book delves into the ways that archaeology and politics intertwined in iraq during the british mandate and the first years of nationhood before world war ii magnus bernhardsson begins with the work of british archaeologists who conducted extensive excavations in iraq and sent their finds to the museums of europe he then traces how iraqis growing sense of nationhood led them to confront the british over antiquities law and the division of archaeological finds between iraq and foreign excavators he shows how iraq s control over its archaeological patrimony was directly tied to the balance of political power and how it increased as power shifted to the iraqi government finally he examines how iraqi leaders including

saddam hussein have used archaeology and history to legitimize the state and its political actions

as a result of the various reforms of the mid nineteenth century tanzimat reorganisation era ottoman authority in iraq was much stronger and better administered by the 1870s than it had been when the ottomans imposed direct rule over the region in the 1830s drawing upon original source documents ebubekir ceylan provides the first comprehensive study of the tanzimat reforms in iraq in the nineteenth century focusing on aspects of political reform modernization and development and analyzing both the successes and failures of the reform process the reforms included administrative and military centralization the establishment of provincial councils and these as well as the ottoman tribal policy and the ottoman contribution to the modernization of urban life and infrastructure ceylan demonstrates that the origins of modern iraq can be found in the period of ottoman rule in the nineteenth century
