without money terrorists cannot function as organizations and cannot conduct attacks yet the questions remain how vulnerable are terrorists to financial disruptions can governments put pressure on their finances in meaningful ways or are they too resilient and adaptive to be affected by state actions these and other questions about terrorism financing are vigorously debated by scholars and policymakers particularly since the attacks of september 11th 2001 while there is a growing literature on policy issues strategies and countermeasures states must first understand their enemies before developing strategies to defeat them so instead of focusing on the state response this book asks a more foundational question how do different terrorist groups actually raise money what are their budgets what do their portfolios look like how have they changed over time what are the advantages and disadvantages of different sources of financing the book includes case studies of 11 different terrorist groups or sets of groups within a country it is clear that each group has a different portfolio tailored to their needs and their environment and this makes countering terrorist financing more challenging for the state this topical book will be required reading for all students and scholars interested in terrorism financing as well as those working in government agencies tasked with combating terrorist groups and their financial resources

groups committing acts of terrorism have adapted their means of financing to elude detection since the 9 11 attacks in the united states surveying the global community's multi year effort to cut off terrorist funding this volume offers a much needed analysis of a complex widely discussed yet poorly understood subject while books on terrorism have touched upon the topic this is the first comprehensive balanced and scholarly overview of terrorist financing its methods and efforts to counter it bringing together leading analysts of terrorism international relations global finance law and criminology countering the financing of terrorism provides a critical assessment of the international effort to restrict terrorist financing it evaluates the costs and benefits and offers recommendations for more effective policies for the future

this book examines the dynamics of terrorist financing including a discussion about the importance of money from both the terrorist and the counter terrorist perspective targeting terrorist financing argues that it is not the institutions that have failed the war on terrorist financing rather it is the states that have failed the institutions the measures contemplated by the world community to interdict terrorists and their financial infrastructures are sufficient to debilitate the terrorists both militarily and financially however what has been increasingly lacking is political will among the states and this has overwhelmed the spirit of cooperation in this very critical front against terrorism this volume assesses the need for international cooperation and the role of institutions and regimes in targeting terrorist financing after the 9 11 attacks there was an expression of global willingness to target terrorism generally and terrorist financing in particular the institutional mechanisms that grew out of this are explored in detail here with a critical examination of the progress made by the international community the impact of these measures is considered with respect to changes in the nature of the terrorist threat money confiscated adoption of international conventions and global standards by states and levels of compliance among others this book will be of great interest to students of terrorism international organisations international security and in general arabinda acharya is research fellow manager of strategic projects and head of the terrorist financing response project at the international centre for political violence and terrorism research in the s rajaratnam school of international studies nanyang technological university singapore

illicit activities that fund such groups the book serves as the most current and comprehensive resource in the area of countering the financing of terrorism and organised crime incorporating regional and group specific approaches challenges and consequences this focus encompasses legal measures social policies and military operations and security force responses by states and non state actors to assemble the most up to date counter terrorist financing information into a single volume

the money laundering ml and terrorist financing tf risks associated with conventional finance are generally well identified and understood by the relevant national authorities there is however no common understanding of ml tf risks associated with islamic finance some are likely to be the same as in conventional finance but there may also be different risks this is notably due to i the complexity of some islamic finance products and ii the nature of the relationship between the institutions and their clients the limited capacity and experience in the supervision of islamic finance especially in jurisdictions that face higher ml tf risk factors represents an additional vulnerability the financial action task force fatf standards are implemented without any form of tailoring to the specificities of islamic finance the fatf the islamic finance standard setters and the national regulators should seek a greater understanding of the specific ml tf risks that may arise in islamic finance and develop an appropriate response

when watching the collapse of the twin towers on cnn 11 september 2001 the international community was awakened to the urgent needs of open discussion to identify the emerging threat and the way to cope with it given the unprecedented heinous nature of the incident the moves that the international community made were quick and included countermeasures in various dimensions one of the major countermeasures highlighted as a result was to target the financial infrastructure of terrorist organisations in this campaign diverse organisations have participated including the security council financial action task force fatf imf world bank etc at the same time various methodologies have also been introduced at both the international and national level such a consensus and mobilisation of sources to one end in the international community may be considered phenomenal in the history of public international law and without doubt merits an in depth analysis for both academic and practical purposes in this context this book examines the evolution and implementation of int national standards on countering the financing of terrorism there are two dimensions to be taken into account to understand the structure of this book the first is concerned with a sequential perspective given that 9 11 has provided a critical momentum in this area chapter 2 deals with the international position prior to 9 11 whereas chapters 3 4 and 5 analyse development following 9 11 the second is related to a hard law and soft law perspective

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governments through their regulatory bodies typically regulate formal financial sector players such as banks which can leave providers working in informal remittance systems outside regulatory channels value transfer services financial transfers performed domestically or across borders on behalf of clients are essential to the financial system and as such are often offered by both formal and informal actors law enforcement and counter terrorism authorities are evaluating money and value transmission channels for vulnerabilities that may make these channels attractive for illicit use including the financing of terrorism alternative remittance systems and terrorism financing issues in risk management aims to help countries bring these informal alternative remittance systems into their counter terrorism programs without hindering the ability of those who depend on these systems to send and receive money at low cost

the us department of justice has suffered several embarrassing and disappointing legal defeats in prosecuting major terrorist financiers the author provides numerous recommendations to congress the executive branch and the un security council for strengthening the legal regime to deny terrorists the money needed to wage global jihad acquire weapons of mass destruction and launch another terrorist attack on the scale of 9 11 unfunding terror fills an important gap in the literature and will be essential reading for counter terrorism experts law enforcement and national se

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
