often the finest artists do not make the best teachers many frustrated college students of art know this all too well as they suffer through unstructured classes with inexperienced teachers or graduate student instructors in these situations it is easy to blame the teachers but the problem is largely institutional most students graduating with mfas from art schools receive little if any instruction in teaching art if you find yourself in this predicament as teacher or student this book is for you the first book to provide a comprehensive guide for teaching college level art the art of teaching art is the culmination of respected artist and instructor deborah rockman s two decades of teaching experience believing that drawing is the backbone of all of the visual arts she
